
Mr. Sams, who is currently a Council Member to the Northwest Power and Conservation Council, possesses a broad range of experience and a valuable skillset. An enrolled member, Cayuse and Walla Walla, of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Tribes, he holds a bachelor's of science degree in Business Administration, as well as a master's of legal studies in Indigenous Peoples Law. A veteran of the U.S. Navy, he has worked in both state and Tribal governments, as well as natural resources and conservation non-profits for more than 25 years.

This is an important nomination that comes at a critical time for the NPS, the cornerstone federal agency for the preservation of our natural and cultural heritage. Mr. Sams' work on natural resources conservation and energy issues gives him key insights on the nexus between environment, energy development and climate change, arguably the most important issue facing our public lands.

It is our hope that he will bring a fresh point of view to management that will reinvigorate morale in the agency, and that he will advocate for badly-needed increases in funding and staff. Finally, as a Native American leader, he will bring a voice and perspective to the NPS that have been underrepresented in the past.

The SAA strongly supports the nomination of Charles Sams III for NPS Director. Thank you for this opportunity to comment.
